

Asialink Reciprocal Residencies

Asialink currently facilitates 3 reciprocal residencies in the Visual Arts sector.

Residents applying to the host organisations below should be aware that they will be awarded a \$9,000 grant towards their airfare, daily living expenses and materials. Up to \$3,000 in-kind support will be offered by the Asian host organisation in the form of accommodation, studio space and exhibition costs.



Tokyo Wonder Site, Japan

Since its opening in 2001, Tokyo Wonder Site has hosted various programs including “Creator-In-Residence”, designed for active creators in the field of visual art, architecture, design, video, music, performing arts, research and curatorship. It is located in central Tokyo, which is considered one of the most fashionable and creative areas in the city. Approximately 100 artists from all over the world reside at TWS Aoyama every year and have opportunities to deepen creative exchanges with both international and local creators, and the citizens of Tokyo. TWS seeks applications from young and emerging contemporary artists. Monash University Museum of Art (MUMA), Melbourne has acted as a reciprocal host organisation for a Japanese artist in 2010 and 2011, and will continue to do so every 2nd year. Asialink is currently finalising the host organisation for the alternate year.

The National Art Studio, Changdong & Goyang

The National Art Studio (Changdong & Goyang), run by the National Museum of Contemporary Art, Korea is a cultural centre designed to build relationships between overseas and local visual artists. Facilities include studios (13 at Changdong and 21 at Goyang) with combined accommodation, and a common kitchen and bathroom. Resident artists can participate in various programs of the National Art Studio including seminars, exhibitions, open studios and education outreach programs. The successful applicant will undertake their residency in either Changdong or Goyang Art Studio according to studio availability. The successful applicant will need to undertake the residency from 2 July – 30 September 2012. Artspace, Sydney has acted as a reciprocal host organisation for a Korean artist on an annual basis since 2010. www.artstudio.or.kr



Taipei Artist Village/ Treasure Hill Artist Village (TAV/THAV) - Taipei

TAV & THAV play an important role in the dialogue, networking and presentation of artwork from Taiwan to the international art world. Located in the centre of Taipei, TAV has 10 residential apartments and studios for international artists and a mission to promote contemporary and avant-garde practices across a range of art forms. THAV is a ‘historic architectural community’. The unique location of Treasure Hill, with its narrow alleys and stairways traversing the hillside, gives THAV a European rural village feel. NB: You can apply to TAV or THAV, or choose not to specify. From 2010 – 11, Perth Institute of Contemporary Arts (PICA) has acted as a reciprocal host organisation for a Taiwanese artist. Asialink is currently finalising the host organisation/s for 2012.
